

# strengthening our community

#### **Fort Wayne Medical Education**


Through our partnership with the Fort Wayne Medical Education Program, medical residents participate in and manage high-risk obstetric patients at Neighborhood Health. During this time, residents spend three half-days per week at Neighborhood Health doing exclusively prenatal care, managing a variety of both routine and complex pregnancies, as well as obstetric deliveries. This partnership expands our expertise and resources, as well as our ability to provide these critical services to at-risk patients.

#### Fort Wayne United Walk

Created in 2018, the Fort Wayne UNITED TenPoint coalition influences the lives of young people, families, local businesses and neighborhoods by implementing proactive strategies to reduce violence. As part of its efforts, the coalition holds Fort Wayne UNITED walks, where foot patrol members visit local neighborhoods to improve conditions and the quality of life for residents. In February 2019, we participated in one of these walks in southeast Fort Wayne to connect with residents and raise awareness of the medical services available to them through Neighborhood Health.

#### **School Sealant Program**

Good dental hygiene starts early — when kids turn six, for example, it's time for a dental sealant to prevent cavities as permanent molars start to show up. In 2019, we partnered with Fort Wayne Community Schools to provide free sealants and a dental check-up to students at 35 FWCS schools.
